




LGA TO LGA COMPARISON OF **LIVELIHOOD SYSTEMS**




PERCENTAGE OF PARTICIPANTS WHO CAN READ A BOOK

(LGA-to-LGA Comparison)




PERCENTAGE OF PARTICIPANTS WHO SLEPT UNDER A MOSQUITO NET A NIGHT BEFORE












