OVERVIEW

The Nigerian governments Universal Basic Education policy, introduced in line with the Millennium Development Goals, is designed to provide free Primary and Junior Secondary Education. The implementation process began in 1999 and was signed into law in 2004. The financing of basic education is the responsibility of States and Local Governments, and the Federal Government provides 2% of its Consolidated Revenue Fund toward this endeavor.³ In the communities surveyed these efforts have been relatively successful, 83% of respondents stated that they do not pay fees for their children's primary school education.

Despite this, the conditions of the primary and secondary schools in the communities surveyed are not conducive to a productive learning environment. The survey revealed poorly furnished, ill-equipped and understaffed primary and secondary schools in many of the communities. None of the primary schools in Warri North LGA is equipped with a library, and based on responses from school administrators, 44% of all primary schools and 56% of secondary schools do not have desks and chairs for students.

The survey revealed that all the communities have primary schools with the exception of Ayama community in Yenagoa LGA, Bayelsa State. Ayama, Akaibiri, and Okutukutu communities in Yenagoa LGA and Jakpa community in Warri North LGA do not have secondary schools.

Education plays an important role in development. According to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), literacy is a tool for active citizenship and a means to pursue other civil, political, economic or social rights. Literacy can improve and expand microenterprises by enhancing book keeping and business management skills. "Literacy advances one's ability to effectively manage group processes, keep accurate record and market the available services, outputs and potentials of an organization [or business]." This is relevant for residents of the surveyed communities who are seeking to expand their livelihood opportunities and microenterprises, and who are members of community based organizations tasked with advocating for improved service delivery and gender equity in decision making.

Through our implementation of the ONLAG project, we have learned that Illiteracy among women has also played a part in contributing to the poor coordination of efforts and collaboration among women groups. Only 38% of the 925 women who participated in this survey can read. Addressing literacy can enhance women's self esteem while sharpening their leadership potential. This considered we included a literacy component in the second phase of ONLAG implementation.

In Okutukutu Community, the Old Women's FG expressed the need for adult education. The Old Women's FG in Oporoma Community noted that while adult education courses are offered, they are not staffed with enough teachers or even chairs for students.

METHODOLOGY

While this section follows the methodology of the preceding sections, it is important to note that in questions relating to teachers, the responses of Younger Women were given more weight than the responses of other focus groups. We made this decision because women have a greater understanding of the educational environment of their children. In questions relating to number of boys and girls enrolled in primary school and the salary of teachers were asked to school administrators during site visits. Where the school administrator was unavailable we recorded the information as "no response"








PERCENTAGE OF COMMUNITIES SURVEYED IN WHICH PRIMARY SCHOOL HAS A LIBRARY








PERCENTAGE OF COMMUNITIES SURVEYED THAT HAS TEACHER'S QUARTERS






